Dear Mr Untermeyer

15th September 1921

For reasons you will understand, I cannot send you a letter by post because of the money and the stocks that you have kindly taken into safekeeping for us. That is why I have asked Mr. Zeisler to convey this letter to you. As we agreed at the time, I hope you have invested the 1 300 Dollars which we gave you on 28th May in American securities. I would like you to add the interest to the investment unless I specifically ask you to send us some of this money. In view of the unstable conditions in Germany, having this investment is of great importance to me. If I can again spare anything in foreign currency, I would like to send it to you so that you can do the same as with the other money.

Regarding the securities of my brother-in-law that my wife similarly entrusted to you, please leave them as they are until their fate is clear. If they should become available, I would like you to sell them and to take German currency for them.

I am sorry to make so much work for you, and I am truly grateful to you for being so kind as to help me in these matters. I hope you and your wife had a nice and satisfying trip to Europe. We are getting on fine, working quietly here at home. I hope and am convinced that your influence on the Zionist development will be beneficial, since you are particularly suited to bringing about mutual understanding between the various groups and to helping to turn the whole undertaking in a positive economic and political direction.
